Notice is hereby given that a vote of the electors will be held on the following:

Based on the findings of the Village of Bittern Lake Viability Review and updated report, which one of the two options below do you support for the future of Bittern Lake? (Select one only)

Option 1. The Village of Bittern Lake remains a village and implements changes to achieve viability.

Option 2. Dissolve the Village of Bittern Lake and Bittern Lake becomes a hamlet in Camrose County.

Voting will take place on the 1st day of **April 2025**, between the hours of **4:00 p.m.** and **8:00 p.m.**, and the 2nd day of **April 2025**, between the hours of **10:00 a.m.** and **4:00 p.m.**


The voting station will be located at: **Bittern Lake Community Hall**

In order to vote, you must produce for inspection one or more of the acceptable forms of identification required by section 53 of the *Local Authorities Elections Act*.

Special ballots (mail-in) are available for electors whose names are contained in the permanent electors register and who are unable to vote at the voting station on the days of the vote. Applications for a special ballot may be made in writing, by telephone, or by email to the Returning Officer. If an elector's name is not contained in the permanent electors register, they are required to complete an application with the Returning Officer.

Special ballots must be returned to the Returning Officer (in Edmonton) by 12:00 p.m. (noon) on Monday, March 31st, 2025.
